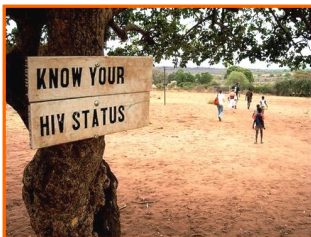

Fortune Nyondo, is the President and CEO of the non-profit **Fortune Pilgrim**. Fortune was born in Kabwe, Zambia and is a well known musician currently living in Seattle WA. Because of the taboo associated with **AIDS and disease**, poor education, and insufficient resources, Zambian people die when it could be prevented, which is what happened to his mother who passed away one day before being tested. Now that he has the resources, education, and reputation to change this destructive pattern in his native country, he is passionately organizing a movement to create change, and save lives.



Obstacles to Health Care:



In Southern Africa, Zambia has one of the world's most devastating HIV and AIDS epidemics. More than one in every seven adults in the country is living with HIV. Many of the obstacles and issues associated with health care in general include:

- * A shortage of health care workers due to emigration and low capacity of national medical and nursing schools
- * Misconceptions about HIV and AIDS: stigma and social rejection
- * Accessing treatment in rural areas is difficult
- * Limited health education programs
 - * Politics and bureaucracy
- * Overall Poverty : unsafe drinking water and poor sanitation
 - * Gender Inequality
 - * No Preventative Care
